















Observations

When I heard about our self-directed project, the only thing that came to my mind was designing a book cover series. Because I am generally interested in book covers and feel confident about designing them. In this project, I thought that I could show my strengh by realising this project. In the search of a topic, I had some ideas such as book cover series for classic era poetry books or holybooks, which I find an underrated field in publishing. As a religious person I am interested in holy books in general, I even read some parts of them in my high school years. For that reason, when I started to my design education, I gradually realised that holy books have not the best book cover designs in the world of books. There are some exceptional/distinctive book cover examples or special editions, but still, the covers generally have conventional and traditional design treatments. It is not only the lack of intrerest about marketing theis kind of books, but also the design choices are not so consciously done. Therefore, publishers do not publish holy books as a series, they usually publish and sell them individually.

Audience

I intended to design a Deluxe Edition addressed not only to religious people but also the people who wants to know more about these holy books.




Analysis of existing market and different editions


After positioning my audience, I looked at the examples in bookstores and the online ones. I saw some different publishing approaches like special editions or cheap paperback editions. But generally, with some exceptions, they had average designs. The Quran has more ornamental and glittered designs and calligraphic typography refers to the Arabic letters. The Bible has a very simplistic design in general only with golden title and cross on a leather cover. The Torah also has different approaches like fabric covered hardbacks or paperbacks with the accompany of Hebrew text. This phase of the project made me understand the holy book market and know better my competitors.








Initial Approaches

My main approach was trying to find a common ground for three different books and combining these different contents to create a unity without overshadowing their individuality. First, I aimed to make impressive covers to get the attention so quickly. So, I used religious symbols for each book in big scales with their represantative colours (As shown on the left). But, the design was shouting too much and looked like a cheap paperback edition.

Later, I thought about using the name of the books in their original language and script. This design was not satisfactory about being Deluxe edition and also there are some examples of it, so I did not want to repeat the same approach. At the end, I decided to use the symbols, but this time I designed a minimal and simple cover with an ivory background and a black slipcase, has printed symbols as patterns on it, for making a contrast in design.






Process/ Methodology


For making a Deluxe Edition, I got some advices from my tutors about the printing and binding techniques. Eventually I decided to use foil blocking technique on a paperback cover with a metallic ink covered by an ivory paper, but at the end of the project, the conditionals and expectations were not suitable for this technique. For this reason, I apolied emboss technique on my book covers instead of foil blocking with the help of and instructions from my tutors. For the slipcase, I got nice shiny effects, by printing patterns on a silky black special paper with a regular printer for the slipcase cover.





From the beginning, me and my tutors were definitely sure about making a slipcase for each book. The slipcase in this project is formed with a board, covered with the black silky smooth paper, printed symbols as patterns on it by a regular printer. I have never done a slipcase before, that is why I found really difficult. For getting familiar with the process, I examined the slipcase designs of Folio Society as reference. But still, I could not get a very successful result.







Final Design

After all critics and brainstormings, I prefered a simple design by using only symbols and representative colours in the front covers. I used the green is for the Quran, gold is for the Bible and blue is for the Torah. I put the title only on the spine.


I used three different coloured endpapers with the same colour of each book both inside of the covers and the slipcases.


